Vocabulary Quiz Guidance

- 2. The vocabulary words are the ones highlighted in RED or in the APPENDIX at the end of each document. These are both words from the story as well as literary terms such as 'theme'
- 3. When studying, a great place to start is the Merriam Webster site. (*Save this website on your browser it is super-useful.*) https://www.merriam-webster.com/
- 4. For each word, it is important to know:
 - a. Its denotation
 - b. Its possible connotations
 - c. Any synonyms that go with the word
 - d. Any examples that can help illustrate the concept
 - e. Understand the context from the stories it arises from

Here are a few examples of question stems to help you study:

- 1. In a complete sentence explain what it means to [vocab word].
- 2. In a sentence or two, explain how [vocab word] can have a negative connotation.
- 3. List two important characteristics of this [vocab word].
- 4. What is the term for [characteristics of the vocab word]?
